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ACCREDITED TEXAS-BRED PROGRAM (ATB)

Any Accredited Texas-Bred that runs first, second, or third in any race (other than a stakes restricted to Accredited Texas-Breds) during the Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie Quarter Horse Meet will receive bonus incentive money distributed by the Texas Quarter Horse Association.

Accredited Texas-Bred Incentives will be paid by the Texas Quarter Horse Association at the conclusion of the meet. That means Accredited Texas-Breds run for bigger purses than horses foaled in other states that are running in the same race. Races restricted to Accredited Texas-Bred horses have bigger purses than the same class of race for open company horses. Incentive awards are distributed 50% to first, 30% to second and 20% to third.

Additional Accredited Texas-Bred awards for breeders and stallion owners are also paid at the conclusion of the meet through the office of the Texas Quarter Horse Association on eligible ATB horses.

Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie will be on a 7 day entry schedule (after opening weekend) without any scratch time or also eligibles. All riders must be named at entry time. The Racing Office will be closed on Mondays & Tuesdays. The Racing Office will open at 8:30 am on entry days and entries will close by 11:00 am.

ELIGIBILITY

No entries will be accepted for the following:

- A horse that is more than 12 years of age may not start in a pari-mutuel race in this state unless:
 - (a) The horse has finished first, second or third in an officially sanctioned race during the 12 month period preceding the race in which the horse is to start; or
 - (b) Upon due consideration of the horse's past performance, the board of stewards has given specific authorization for the horse to start.
- Entries will not be accepted for horses that are deemed to be non competitive or unfit to race by the Racing Secretary, Stewards or State Veterinarian.

COGGINS AND HEALTH CERTIFICATES

To be admitted on to Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie's grounds, a horse must have:

1. A negative test for equine infections anemia conducted in accordance with rules of the Texas Animal Health Commission in the twelve-month period preceding the horse's arrival. It is a criminal offense to transfer ownership of a horse (by Bill of Sale or Claim) without a current negative Coggins. To keep Coggins test from expiring during the meeting, they **MUST** be dated after NOVEMBER 28, 2019. **The current negative Coggins test MUST be turned in with the foal papers in order to race and receive a preference date.**
2. A health certificate issued in the 30-day period preceding horse's arrival.
3. We also continue to require that all horses admitted to the stable area to have a current (180 day) FDA approved EHV-1 vaccine or EHV-1 booster. Vaccine information must be noted on the health certificate for admittance to Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie's grounds.

EQUINE PIROPLASMOSIS

A negative Piroplasmosis cElisa test for Theileria equi that has been performed in the last year is mandatory for all quarter horses. This policy is for all horses shipping into the stable area of Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie regardless of their origin. **The current negative test must also be turned in with the foal papers in order to race and receive a preference date.**

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VETERINARIAN'S EXAMS

Pre-race veterinarian examinations will be conducted starting at 3:00 pm. Horses shipping into the Receiving Barn will need to be in the barn **60 minutes** prior to the published post time for the first race of the day. Any horses shipping into barns other than the Receiving Barn, need to notify the Commission Veterinarians of

their barn and stall location. **Time schedule is based upon these arrangements.** All ship-in horses on the Texas Furosemide Program should be on the grounds at least five (5) hours prior to the post time of their scheduled race. Please have horse's legs unwrapped and clean for their examination. For further information please call the test barn at (972) 237-5012.

ENTRY RULES

1. Racing Office will open for entries at 8:30 am. Entries close by 11:00 am.
2. A horse must be tattooed, and the registration papers and current negative Coggins must be on file in the Racing Secretary's office not later than one hour before post time for the first race of that day.
3. When a person makes a coupled entry, the entry with the better date will be preferred in an overnight race. If they have the same date, the trainer must declare their first and second choice. Two horses having a common tie through ownership or trainer cannot start to the exclusion of a single interest (excluding stakes races). However, a second choice has preference over an in-today horse. All coupled entries must have a second rider named one hour prior to the first post time.
4. A blinker change must be approved by the starter and reported at time of entry.
5. In all races, winners are preferred except where the conditions of the race state otherwise. Maidens entering in a winner's race must declare at time of entry that the horse is a maiden.
6. Owners and Trainers must be careful to claim allowances and preference date at time of entry. This is the sole responsibility of the person making the entry.
7. Horses not entitled to the first allowance in a race are not entitled to the second and, if not to the second, then to any subsequent allowances.

No horse shall be entered in more than one race on any racing day (excluding stakes races).

WORKOUTS AND FIRST-TIME STARTERS

If a horse has not started in the **60-day period** preceding a race, the horse must have **one published workout** to be eligible to start in that race. If a horse is a **first-time starter**, the horse must have **two published workouts, one of which must be from the starting gate within 90 days and one must be within the last 60 days of the race entered**, in order to be eligible to start in a race. The first-time starter must also be approved from the starting gate by the Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie starter for proficiency in the starting gate. **First time starters around the turn** must be approved by the clocker prior to entering in a one turn race and have a **minimum 660 yard** published workout within the last **60 days**. Trainers must notify the clocker prior to working a horse for turn approval.

All horses working at Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie must be identified by name (breeding if unnamed), type of workout and distance to the Gap Attendant. Failure to report this information will result in referral to the stewards. Foal certificates must be on file in the Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie Racing Office before a horse will receive an official work.

HORSEMEN'S BOOKKEEPING

In order to better serve the horsemen running at the numerous tracks throughout the State of Texas, the horsemen's bookkeeping system is centralized by the Texas Horsemen's Partnership. It is now similar to branch banking. This means that any necessary account maintenance can be done from any racetrack running a live meet in the state and through the Texas Horsemen's Partnership main office in Austin year round. Prior to starting a race an owner must have on deposit with the Horsemen's Bookkeeper the amount required to cover all costs incurred in starting that horse. Prior to putting in a claim for a horse the owner or their Designated Representative must insure that all funds incurred with claiming a horse are on deposit in said account. PREFERENCE SYSTEM

1. Preference date will not be assigned until the horse's papers and current negative Coggins and Piroplasmosis tests are on file in the Racing Office.
2. Preference dates will not supersede the conditions of a race.

3. In any overnight race, regardless of conditions, an 'in today' horse is ALWAYS least preferred and the second part of an entry (by owner or trainer) cannot enter to the exclusion of a single interest. Though the second part of an entry is preferred over an 'in today'.
4. All horses registered on or before **SUNDAY, AUGUST 30, 2020** will receive a zero, which is the lowest date. A horse keeps his zero until he runs, scratches, or the papers are removed from the Office (unless, for just cause - tattoo, corrections, etc.) the Racing Secretary may determine the status of the preference date established.
5. All horses registering on the first racing day and afterwards will receive an "E date" corresponding to the racing day of the meeting when registered. When an "E" date and "R" dates have the same number, the "E" date has preference.
6. Preference dates are good at any distance.
7. A zero has first preference – except in two year old maiden allowance races.
8. **SPECIAL DATES FOR TWO YEAR OLD MAIDEN ALLOWANCE HORSES.....**
Any two year old quarter horse maiden with a Zero date that is excluded from any two year old maiden allowance race will then receive a "01" date. Any two year old maiden with a "01" date that is then excluded from any two year old maiden allowance race will receive a "02" date and so on. In any maiden two year old allowance race, a "01" will be preferred over a "0", and a "02" will be preferred over a "01" and so on. These special dates will only be used and granted in all two year old maiden special weight races. (unless other preference is stated in the race)
9. Horses that run will receive a running date corresponding to the date they race and lose all dates previously held. This excludes stakes and trials.
10. Horses which scratch or are scratched will keep their preference date as if they had run.
11. All horses placed on the Steward's, Starter's or Veterinarian's lists will be posted on the bulletin board. They will not be permitted to enter until they have been approved to start. A horse which raced before going on a list will keep its R date. Horses which were scratched will be given an R date of the day the horse comes off the list.
12. If a horse is registered or comes off a list on a non-racing day, the next racing day will be used.
13. In no way does claiming, ownership transfer or trainer transfer of a horse affect the preference date.
14. It is the responsibility of the person making an entry to claim preference at time of entry. The Stewards will consider no claims that do not comply with the above regulations.
15. When a horse's name appears in a race and is entered for the following day, such entry will be given no consideration should the race in which it is entered is overfilled.
16. Horse papers with an ownership transfer will not be accepted and a preference date will not be assigned.

TATTOOING

All horses must be tattooed to be eligible to start. The cost of tattooing a horse is \$100, which must be paid prior to the horse being tattooed. Contact Kelly Flowers @ AQHA @ (806) 378-4365

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LICENSING

*****Multiple Year Licenses are available for the following:
 Jockeys, Owners, Trainers and Veterinarians.**

Prior to entering a horse at Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie, all participants [Trainer and Owner(s)] should have a current Texas Racing Commission License.

TRAINERS:

1. All Trainers should be licensed prior to the entry procedure.
2. It is the trainer's responsibility to keep the Texas Racing Commission licensing office current on their owners' and employees' status. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action by the stewards.
3. Whenever a trainer terminates an employee, the licensing office should be notified and badge returned. The license badge may be returned to the licensee if and when he/she is employed by another licensed trainer.

OWNERS:

1. All Owners, as listed on the horse's registration papers, should be licensed prior to the entry of that horse.
2. Owners' license will not be issued unless a licensed trainer is named on his/her application.
3. If an owner is unable to complete his/her application due to the illness or absence, the licensed trainer desiring to enter the horse may complete an emergency owner's license for the absent owner.
4. All owners who lease horses for racing purposes are responsible for licensing both the Lessee and Lessor.
5. If the owner is not an individual, each partner who has an ownership interest of five percent (5%) or more must be licensed by the Texas Racing Commission.
6. A person may not be licensed as an owner if the person is not the owner of record of a properly registered race animal which the person intends to race in Texas which is in the care of a trainer licensed by the Texas Racing Commission.

NOTE: Owners, trainers, lessors and lessees **must** be licensed prior to post time for the first race of the day. License forms can be obtained in advance by calling the Texas Racing Commission at (512) 833-6699.

RECEIVING BARN

All horses shipping in to race must stable in the receiving barn. Horses shipping in to Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie to work or shipping earlier than their scheduled race day must contact the Stall Superintendent before shipping. All horses shipping in to work must vacate the receiving barn by 11:00 am.

DORMITORY ROOMS

Dormitory rooms will be assigned to trainers based on the number of stalls they have been assigned. The trainer is required to pay \$50 for each room allotted. Keys must be returned and rooms maintained to the satisfaction of Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie management, if not, additional charges may apply. The stall superintendent will assign dormitory rooms.

CLAIMING RULES

Sec. 313.301. Eligibility to Claim

- (a) Except as otherwise provided by this section, in a claiming race, each horse is subject to be claimed for its entered price by:
 - (1) a licensed owner or lessee or an authorized agent acting on behalf of the owner or lessee;
 - (2) a person who has applied for an owner's license and has been granted approval by the stewards to make a claim.

- (b) A claim may not be made directly or indirectly by an owner for his or her own horse.

Sec. 313.302. Claim Procedure

- (a) A steward or a designee of the stewards shall supervise the making of claims and ensure the accuracy of all claims made in a race.
- (b) A claim must be made in writing on forms and in envelopes approved by the executive secretary. The form and envelope must be filled out completely and must be accurate in every detail. For purpose of this section, the name of the horse as it appears in the official program governs.
- (c) The person making a claim is responsible for determining the sex of the horse.
- (d) A claim must be time stamped with the official track time shown on the tote board and deposited in a locked box provided by the Racing Secretary not later than 15 minutes before post time of the race in which the horse being claimed is to start. A person may not place money or its equivalent in the claim box.
- (e) Before the deadline for filing claims for a race, a person may not: open the box in which claims are deposited; or reveal information regarding the filing of a claim.
- (f) After the deadline for filing claims for a race, a Steward or a designee of the stewards shall open the box, examine the claims, and notify the stewards of all accurate claims. The stewards or designee will then notify the horsemen's bookkeeper of the claims to determine whether the appropriate amount is on deposit with the bookkeeper in accordance with 313.305 (relating to amounts of deposit) and to debit the claimant's account for the amount of the claim, plus all applicable fees. If more than one person enters a claim for a horse, a steward or a designee of the stewards shall determine the disposition of the horse by lot.

Sec. 313.303. Effective Time of Claim

- (a) A person who has a valid claim to a horse becomes the owner of the horse when the horse goes on to the racetrack for the race. This subsection applies regardless of whether the horse reaches the starting gate and regardless of subsequent injury to the horse during or after the race.
- (b) On the day claimed, a claimed horse runs in the interest of and for the account of the owner from whom the horse was claimed.

Sec. 313.304. Claim Irrevocable

- (a) Except as otherwise provided by this section, a claim that is filed in accordance with this subchapter is irrevocable.
- (b) If the stewards declare a claiming race a "no-race", all claims for that race are invalid.

Sec. 313.305. Amounts of Deposit

- (a) To make a valid claim, a person must have on deposit with the horsemen's bookkeeper an amount of the claim, plus all transfer fees, in the form of cash, money order, certified check or cashier's check.
- (b) A person who files a claim may not exhaust the person's account with the association during the two-hour period after the claim was filed.

Sec. 313.306. Transfer of Claimed Horse

- (a) A horse that has been claimed in a claiming race shall be taken after the race to the area designated by the association for delivery to the claimant, unless the horse is designated for testing. **PLEASE NOTE THAT CLAIMED HORSES WILL BE EXCHANGED IN THE TEST BARN IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE RACE.**
- (b) A person may not refuse to deliver a claimed horse.
- (c) The registration certificate of a claimed horse, and both certificates of a dually registered claimed horse, shall transfer to the successful claimant.
- (d) The engagements of a claimed horse automatically transfer to the new owner. A claimed horse is ineligible for entry in a future race unless the entry is made on behalf of the new owner.
- (e) A horse may not be delivered to a successful claimant without authorization from a steward or a designee of the stewards.

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Sec. 313.307. Responsibility of Testing

The trainer losing a horse through a claim is nevertheless responsible for the results of any drug tests performed on specimens obtained from the horse. The trainer is responsible for the horse during the testing procedures and may not deliver the horse to the successful claimant in the test barn until the commission veterinarian informs the trainer or representative that all testing procedures are complete.

Sec. 313.308. Restrictions on Subsequent Use

- (c) A horse claimed in a claiming race in Texas:
- (1) may not be sold or transferred in whole or part, by any method other than a claiming race during the 30-day period after the initial claim;

- (2) and is ineligible to start in a race at a race meeting other than the one at which it was claimed until the end of the meeting at which the horse was claimed.
- (d) A horse claimed in another state is subject to the eligibility requirements for claimed horses in effect at the time of the claim in the jurisdiction in which the horse was claimed.

GROOM'S ATTIRE

All grooms should be neatly dressed and wear a numbered vest when taking horses to the paddock.

HOTWALKERS

For lease or service information about any of the hotwalkers please contact the racing office at (972) 237-1130 or toll-free at (888) 4RACING.

CONDITION ELIGIBILITY PREFERENCE

Condition eligibility means horses that meet the condition of the race are preferred over those that do not. For Example: Winners of two (2) races entering into non-winners of three (3) races would have preference over a horse that has only one (1) win regardless of preference date. A specific preference clause in a race will supersede these rules. In all overnight races, winners shall be preferred.

PONY PERSON'S ATTIRE

Pony persons taking horses to the post must wear a Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie shirt, jacket and helmet cover. The required items are available for purchase in the Jockey's Room. All pony people are required to wear a safety helmet and sign a policies and procedures statement.

OWNER'S SILKS & FOAL PAPERS

Other than Stakes Races – house silks will be used for the 2020 Quarter Horse Meet. We will use owners' silks for Stake Races and they should be turned into the jocks' room. Following the conclusion of the meet please arrange for your silks and foal papers to be picked up. Although Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie makes every effort to insure the safety of both, we will not be held responsible for either silks or foal papers left later than one week after the final day of the meet.

NAMING OF JOCKEYS

1. Each horse to be drawn into the race must have its jockey named by the time established by the Racing Secretary for the draw of post positions and before the overnight is printed.
2. An apprentice allowance may only be claimed before entries have closed.

It is the trainer's responsibility to engage and name a jockey before the drawing of the race. Should a jockey remain unnamed at the time of the drawing of entries, the Stewards or their appointee shall select one. No jockey, once named, shall be changed except for good cause by the Stewards.

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HELMET AND SAFETY VEST

At Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie, all jockeys and exercise people including pony persons must wear both a helmet and safety vest on the racetrack at all times. TxRC 311.216 ©: A licensee who is mounted on a horse or stable pony on association grounds must wear an A.S.T.M. approved safety helmet at all times. 311.216 (d): A licensee may not hold a horse in a starting gate unless the licensee wears a properly fastened safety helmet approved by A. S. T. M.

The outriders will enforce these rules for your safety.

LASIX

No prohibited drug, chemical, or other substance may be administered to an animal within the 24-hour period before the post time for the race in which the animal is entered.

Phenylbutazone: Phenylbutazone (Bute) is the only approved anti-inflammatory drug, which may be present in the body of a horse while participating in a race. The test level of Bute shall not exceed two (2) micrograms (mg) per milliliter (ml) of plasma.

BLEEDER PROGRAM – Texas Racing Commission Excerpts:

Diagnosis of EIPH (a Bleeder). A bleeder is a horse that experiences Exercise Induced Pulmonary Hemorrhage (EIPH). Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, the medical diagnosis of EIPH may be made only by a commission veterinarian or a veterinarian currently licensed by the commission. If the first EIPH event experienced by a horse in another pari-mutuel racing jurisdiction will also constitute a first report of a diagnosed EIPH event for purposes of this section. A veterinarian who diagnoses an EIPH event in a horse participating in pari-mutuel racing in this state shall report the event to the commission veterinarian in a format prescribed by the executive secretary. On receipt of the first report of a diagnosed EIPH event for a horse, the commission veterinarian shall certify the horse as a bleeder.

Admission to the Furosemide Program. (1) A trainer may admit a horse to the furosemide program by stating at the time of entry that the horse will compete with furosemide. (2) A horse that competed with furosemide in its most recent start out-of-state must compete on furosemide in Texas unless withdrawn from the furosemide program at the time of entry. (3) The voluntary administration of furosemide without an external bleeding incident shall not subject the horse to an initial period of ineligibility under Subsection (g) of this section.

Administration of Furosemide. Furosemide shall be administered to a horse in the furosemide Program not later than four hours before the published post time for the race the horse is entered to run. The furosemide must be administered intravenously by a veterinarian licensed by the commission. The executive secretary shall periodically publish the permissible blood levels of Furosemide in post race specimens and shall post the levels at each licensed racetrack.

Requirement to Use Furosemide. A horse in the furosemide Program in Texas must compete with furosemide until withdrawn from the Program.

Withdrawal from Furosemide. (1) To withdraw a horse from the furosemide program, the trainer must state his/her intention to race the horse without furosemide at the time of entry (2) A horse in the furosemide program that competes out-of-state without furosemide is considered to have been removed from the Texas furosemide program effective the date of its first race without furosemide. (3) Withdrawal from the furosemide program does not prohibit a horse from subsequent readmission to the program in accordance with this section.

Readmission to the Furosemide Program. A horse may be readmitted to the furosemide program if: (1) at least 60 days have elapsed since the horse was withdrawn from the program. (2) the horse is required to compete with furosemide pursuant to subsection (a) (2) of this section; or (3) the commission veterinarian diagnoses the horse with another EIPH event.

Bleeders List (1) The commission veterinarian shall maintain a list of horses that have been certified as bleeders and a list of horses that have been admitted to the furosemide Program. (2) On receipt of a report of diagnosed EIPH event, the commission veterinarian shall place the horse on the veterinarian's list. For the first diagnosed EIPH event, a horse shall be placed on the veterinarian's list and is ineligible to start in a race before the 12th day after the date of the EIPH event. For the second diagnosed EIPH event – 30 days. For the third diagnosed EIPH event – 180 days. For the fourth diagnosed EIPH event – Barred from pari-mutual racing in this state. A horse that does not have a diagnosed EIPH (bleeder) event for 365 consecutive days is considered a non-bleeder for the purpose of the paragraph. The report of a diagnosed EIPH event from any pari-mutuel jurisdiction which officially records EIPH events will be recognized as an EIPH event by the commission. (3) Notwithstanding the foregoing, if after reviewing a report of a diagnosed EIPH event the commission veterinarian determines additional days on the veterinarian's list are essential to the health and safety of the horse, the commission veterinarian may extend the number of days the horse is on the veterinarian's list. The commission veterinarian shall record the medical reasons for the additional days.

Report by Veterinarian A veterinarian who administers furosemide to a horse that has been admitted to the furosemide program shall report the administration on a form prescribed by the commission. A report made under this subsection must be filed with the commission veterinarian not later than one hour before post time for the first race that day.

SHOE RULES

Under TXRC Section 313.426 (a) A Thoroughbred or Arabian is ineligible to start in a race when it has shoes (racing plates) that have toe grabs with a height greater than two millimeters (0.07874 inches), bends, jar chinks, stickers or any other traction device on the front hooves.

(b) A Quarter Horse, Paint Horse or Appaloosa is ineligible to start in a race when it has shoes (racing plates) that have toe grabs with a height greater than four millimeters (0.15748 inches), bends, jar chinks, stickers or any other traction device on the front hooves.

All shoes will be inspected upon arrival in the paddock and violators will be scratched and are subject to be fined.

SCRATCH POLICY

Permission of the Stewards is required for all horses wishing to be scratched at Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie.

PERMISSIBLE MEDICATION LEVELS

In accordance with TXRC Rule Section 319.3(b)-(d), the following substances are permissible if found at or below the following specified concentration levels in post-race samples taken from a horse:

Phenylbutazone	2 mcg/ml in plasma or serum OR .5 mcg/ml in plasma or serum if flunixin present over 3 ng/ml
Acepromazine	HEPS 10 ng/ml in urine
Albuterol	1 ng/ml in urine
Betamethasone/Betasone	10 pg/ml in plasma or serum
Butorphanol	300 ng/ml of total butorphanol in urine 2 ng/ml of free butorphanol in plasma or serum
Cetirizine	6 ng/ml of plasma or serum
Cimetidine	400 ng/ml of plasma or serum
Clenbuterol/Ventipulmin	Prohibited in Texas
Dantrolene	100 pg/ml in plasma or serum
Detomidine	1 ng/mL in plasma or serum, 2 ng/ml of carboxydetomidine in urine
Dexamethasone	5 pg/ml in plasma or serum
Diclofenac	5 ng/ml in plasma or serum
DMSO	10 mg/ml in plasma or serum
Firoxib	20 ng/ml in plasma or serum
Flunixin	Primary: 20 ng/ml in plasma or serum, Secondary Stacking: 3 ng/ml of plasma or serum
Furosemide	100 ng/ml in plasma or serum and urine specific gravity <1.010
Glycopyrrolate	3 pg/ml in plasma or serum
Guaifenesin	12 ng/ml of plasma or serum
Isoflupredone	100 pg/ml in plasma or serum
Ketoprofen	Primary: 2 ng/ml in plasma or serum, Secondary Stacking: 1 ng/ml of plasma or serum
Lidocaine	20 pg/ml of total 3-OH-lidocaine in plasma or serum
Mepivacaine serum	3-OH-mepivacaine-10 ng/ml in urine or mepivacaine at limit detection in plasma or serum
Methocarbamol	1 ng/ml in plasma or serum

Total Carbon Dioxide	Must remain below 37 mmol/L of serum

NSAID Stacking Violations

The presence of more than one non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) constitutes an NSAID stacking violation under the following circumstances:

(A) A Class 1 NSAID stacking violation occurs when:

(1) two NSAIDs are found at individual levels determined to exceed the following restrictions:

- Diclofenac – 5 nanograms per milliliter of plasma or serum;
- Firocoxib – 20 nanograms per milliliter of plasma or serum;
- Flunixin – 20 nanograms per milliliter of plasma or serum;
- Ketoprofen – 2 nanograms per milliliter of plasma or serum;
- Phenylbutazone – 2 micrograms per milliliter of plasma or serum; or
- all other NSAIDs – laboratory level of detection in plasma, serum or urine; or

(2) three or more NSAIDs are found at individual levels determined to exceed the following restrictions:

- Diclofenac – 5 nanograms per milliliter of plasma or serum;
- Firocoxib – 20 nanograms per milliliter of plasma or serum;
- Flunixin – 3 nanograms per milliliter of plasma or serum;
- Ketoprofen – 1 nanogram per milliliter of plasma or serum;
- Phenylbutazone – .3 micrograms per milliliter of plasma or serum; or
- all other NSAIDs – laboratory level of detection in plasma, serum or urine

(B) A Class 2 NSAID stacking violation occurs when any one substance listed in Subsection (A)(1) above is found in excess of the limits stated therein in combination with any one of the following substances at levels below the restrictions contained therein in combination with any one of the following substances at levels below the restrictions stated in Subsection (A)(1) but in excess of the following levels:

- (1) Flunixin – 3 nanograms per milliliter of plasma or serum;
- (2) Ketoprofen – 1 nanogram per milliliter of plasma or serum; or
- (3) Phenylbutazone – 0.3 micrograms per milliliter of plasma or serum.

(C) A Class 3 NSAID stacking violation occurs when any combination of two of the following NSAIDs are found at or below the restrictions in Subsection (A)(1)(a through e) above but in excess of the following levels:

- (1) Flunixin – 3 nanograms per milliliter of plasma or serum;
- (2) Ketoprofen – 1 nanogram per milliliter of plasma or serum; or
- (3) Phenylbutazone – 0.3 micrograms per milliliter of plasma or serum.

EQUINE INJURY DATABASE

In consideration of the acceptance of an entry of any horse to any race described in this Condition Book, the owner(s) and trainer of such horse consent to the collection of information related to any equine injury occurring at the Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie facility to such horse and entry of said information into a database maintained by The Jockey Club (the "Equine Injury Database"). Said owner(s) and trainer further agree to indemnify, release, hold harmless and covenant not to sue Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie, any state or track appointed veterinarian collecting such information and The Jockey Club (collectively, the "Indemnified Parties") from and against any liability, cost, loss, or expense of any kind or nature (including, without limitation, reasonable attorney's fees) arising from any claim, demand, or action (a) alleging that the data entered into the Equine Injury Database (either directly or indirectly) violates the rights of the owner(s), trainer or third party, or (b) relating to any equine injury report run, published or otherwise created by any of the Indemnified Parties, including the owners, stewards, directors, officers, employees and agents of any of them (either directly or indirectly).

LIABILITY NOTICE

In participating at Lone Star Park, applicant recognizes the risks of the activities to be conducted at the Racetrack by or on behalf of applicant, the owners of the horses named in this application and all other persons for whom applicant is acting (applicant and such owners and other persons are collectively referred to as "indemnifying parties"), and has determined that the facilities at the Racetrack are reasonably suited for all horse racing related activities to be conducted by or on behalf of any such parties. Global Gaming LSP, LLC (and its partners, officers, directors, agents, vendors, employees, contractors, visitors and licensees collectively "Lone Star") shall not be liable to any of the

indemnifying parties or any of their employees, agents, invitees or visitors, or to any other person whomsoever, for any injury to persons or damage to property on the Racetrack premises or any adjacent area caused by the negligence or misconduct of any of the indemnifying parties, their employees, agents, invitees, visitors or any other person entering the Racetrack premises under express or implied invitation of any of the indemnifying parties, or arising out of the use of the Racetrack premises and facilities by any of the indemnifying parties. The indemnifying parties hereby agree to release Lone Star from and to indemnify and hold Lone Star harmless from any liability, loss, expense or claims (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of such injury or damage. The indemnifying parties shall not be liable to Lone Star or to any other person whomsoever entering the Racetrack premises under express or implied invitation of Lone Star, for any injury to persons or damage to property on the Racetrack premises or any adjacent area caused by the negligence or misconduct of Lone Star, and Lone Star agrees to release the indemnifying parties from and to indemnify and hold the indemnifying parties harmless from any liability, loss, expense or claims (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of any such injury or damage. In the event of any inconsistency between these provisions and any mandatory provisions of the Texas Racing Act or Rules of Racing, the Texas Racing Act or Rules of Racing, as applicable, shall control. Further, these provisions shall be deemed to be amended to the extent of, and to be in compliance with, any mandatory provisions of any amendment to the Texas Racing Act or Rules of Racing. The foregoing release and indemnification provisions shall be construed in a manner consistent with the limitations set forth herein to be as broad and inclusive as permitted by the laws of the State of Texas.

PURSE DISTRIBUTION

All places shall be paid in overnight races. Sixth through last place shall receive the following:
Thoroughbred/Arabian - \$100
Quarter Horse/Paint - \$50

First through fifth place purse distribution shall be paid the following percentages after sixth through last place is paid out of the total purse:

First – 60%, Second – 20%, Third – 11%, Fourth – 6% and Fifth – 3%

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STABLE RULES

Lone Star Park Security will inspect and enforce the following:

1. Please remember that all manure must be placed in the bins provided for this purpose. Lone Star Park employees will remove only the manure placed in the bins. It is the responsibility of each trainer and his employees to see that the excess manure around the bins is raked up and placed inside the bins for proper disposal.
2. Dogs are not allowed in the stable area.
3. Only Lone Star Park rental hotwalkers are permitted.
4. All hoses located in the stable area must have an automatic shut-off nozzle and shall be turned off when not in use.
5. All washing machines must be located near or inside wash racks and empty into wash rack drains. (EPA Regulation)
6. All horse bathing with soaps or detergents must be done in the wash racks. (EPA Reg.)
7. Trainers will be responsible for Universal Waste left at their barns such as batteries, tires, paints, oils or any chemicals that are considered harmful to the environment.
8. Ponies are not allowed in the paddock or on the turf course.
9. Smoking is not permitted in the barns.
10. Alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the stable area.
11. Firearms or fireworks are not permitted in the stable area.

12. All shavings must be bagged except for your initial bedding.
13. All licensees must wear their badge in the stable area, test barn, holding barn & paddock.
14. Maintenance work orders must be filled out & signed by Trainers or Assistant Trainers & will be addressed on a daily basis. For emergencies, after hours & weekends call x 4307.

MANURE HANDLING PROCEDURES

Due to federal and state regulations, serious and monetarily substantial regulatory penalties can be imposed on Lone Star Park for allowing the improper handling of manure and bedding materials on the property. Every due diligence effort and precaution must be employed to prevent the contamination of ground water and migration of manure effluence into the storm drains.

- Lone Star Park is responsible for providing sufficient designated manure/bedding containers for each barn.
- It is the trainer's and his employee's responsibility to ensure that all manure and bedding is properly disposed of in the designated containers at each barn at all times.
- Trainers and their employees are also responsible to ensure that any manure and/or bedding dropped from the wheel barrels between the barn and the designated containers is subsequently picked up and placed in the designated containers.
- If the designated containers reach their capacity, trainers must call the stall superintendent at (972)237-5058 to request an additional container. Do not overfill the containers.
- Trainers and their employees are responsible for assuring that all trash, bottles and cans, etc. are properly placed in the trash containers provided at the ends of each barn and not in the designated manure containers.
- Trainers and their employees are responsible for picking up and properly disposing of all manure deposited by their horses while on the hotwalkers. No bedding materials are permitted around the hotwalkers.
- Additionally horses must be washed only in the designated horse wash racks inside each barn.
- And all washing machines must drain into the wash rack drains inside the barn.
